ORDER

The devastation caused by the November 2013 typhoon (Typhoon Haiyan, also known as Typhoon Yolanda) that struck portions of Southeast Asia, including the Republic of the Philippines, resulted in disruption of postal operations. As a result, the Court issued Miscellaneous Order No. 01-14, staying appeals where the appellant resides in the affected area, absent specific requests by such appellant that his or her case proceed. According to a recent U.S. Postal Service international service alert, postal operations have now resumed, although delays may be possible as a result of ongoing construction of roads and relocation of residents. Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that any stay resulting from Misc. Order 01-14 is hereby LIFTED. Any party who continues to be affected by postal service delays associated with this natural disaster may request appropriate relief on a case-by-case basis.
