ORDER

Pursuant to 38 U.S.C. § 7257(b)(1), eligible retired Judges of the Court may be recalled by the Chief Judge when further service is needed by the Court. Retired Judge William A. Moorman, having complied with 38 U.S.C. § 7257, is designated a recall-eligible retired Judge. The Chief Judge of the Court has determined that, if recalled, Judge Moorman would provide substantial service necessary to meet the needs of the Court.

Upon consideration of the foregoing, it is

ORDERED that, effective January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2017, recall-eligible retired Judge Moorman is recalled from retired status in accordance with 38 U.S.C. § 7257(b)(1). Judge Moorman shall have and exercise all the judicial powers and duties of the office of a Judge in active service and shall otherwise perform substantial service for the Court as requested by the Chief Judge. It is further

ORDERED that Judge Moorman shall serve in recalled status in calendar year 2017 to review and decide appeals, motions, and other filings with the Court and to perform other substantial service at the request of the Chief Judge and he shall so serve throughout the calendar year for up to 90 days or its equivalent. With his consent, Judge Moorman's service may be extended beyond 90 days.
